valon is an independent, college-preparatory, Catholic K-12 day school for boys. Avalon was founded in 2003. The School's first senior class graduated in June 2007. There are 202 students in total, 127 in grades K-8 and 75 in grades 9-12. There are 17 students in the class of 2024.

Avalon is approved to operate an elementary and secondary school by the Maryland State Department of Education. Avalon has 21 full-time faculty members and 2 part-time faculty members.

To augment their course list, students can enroll in online independent study, including Advanced Placement courses, for courses that are not offered by Avalon. Upperclassmen with a qualifying GPA and with the permission of the Headmaster may seek dual enrollment at a nearby college or university.

Grading Scale

There are two semesters with end-of-term exams in January and June. Grades are scored: A 90–100, B 80–89, C 70–79, D 60–69, F0–59.


