



SCHOOL PROFILE 2025–2026

Avalon is an independent, college-preparatory, Catholic K–12 day school for boys. Avalon was founded in 2003. The School's first senior class graduated in June 2007. There are 231 students in total, 156 in grades K–8 and 75 in grades 9–12. There are 16 students in the class of 2025.

Avalon is approved to operate an elementary and secondary school by the Maryland State Department of Education. Avalon has 21 full-time faculty members and 2 part-time faculty members.

Upper School Course Offerings

English: I, II, III, IV, AP Language, AP Literature, Dystopian Novels, Literature of the Vietnam War, Tolkien's Literature
Mathematics: Pre-Algebra, Algebra I, II, Geometry, Trigonometry, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC
Sciences: Biology, AP Biology, Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics (online), Anatomy & Physiology
World Languages: Spanish I, II, III, Italian, Latin I, II, III, IV
Theology: Scripture, Church History, Sacraments, Moral Theology, The Trinity, and Apologetics
History: Medieval/Early Modern, US, AP US, AP European, History of the Crusades, 20th Century, Government, English Kings, and Literature of the Vietnam War
Electives: Astronomy, Journalism, Creative Writing, Drawing, Composition, Dystopian Literature, Geography, Studio Art, Civics, How Things Work, etc.

To augment their course list, students can enroll in online independent study, including Advanced Placement courses, for courses that are not offered by Avalon. Upperclassmen with a qualifying GPA and with the permission of the Headmaster may seek dual enrollment at a nearby college or university.

Grading Scale

There are two semesters with end-of-term exams in January and June. Grades are scored: A 90–100, B 80–89, C 70–79, D 60–69, F0–59. GPA is calculated:

Composite: 1210

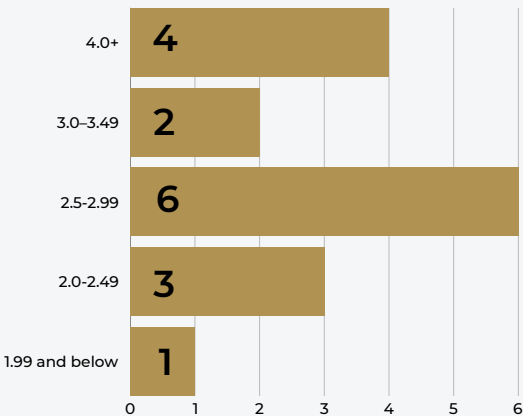
Advanced Placement
